# ENHANCING THE PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF INFECTION FOR RESPONSE TO COVID-19 IN BRAZIL (PREVCOVID-BR)

### PREVCOVID-BR starting activities

Brazil is currently the second country with the largest number of COVID-19 cases worldwide. The occurrence of COVID-19 significantly affects disproportionate health workers and patients admitted to health services. However, it is recognized that good practices in infection prevention and control can prevent transmission in health services. In this context, the project proposal is inserted entitled "Enhancing the prevention and control of infection to respond to COVID-19 in Brazil" (PREVCOVID-BR), which is an extension project.



It is a project in improvements, the main goal is to provide support service technician selected health for the coping with COVID-19 and protect workers and

- •Quick identification of COVID-19 suspects (outpatients, inpatients, visitors and workers);
- •Immediate implementation of specific precautions and isolation;
- •Immediate reference for testing and care level according to need and national protocols, state and municipal laws.

The project is under development in public and general hospitals of **São Paulo and Manaus**. The PREVCOVID-BR development relies on participation of experienced trained professionals to work on the project as fellows with administrative or professional functions infection control. Fellows began their activities at participating institutions and all were very well received! In this third week of September we will start data collection, which comprises, in principle, the characterization of hospitals and the first step of assessing responsiveness from hospitals to COVID-19.
